A KIDS' GUIDE TO KEEPING SAFE ON THE INTERNET

- ❖ **Never** tell anyone you meet on the internet your telephone number, home address or your school's name unless your parent/guardian specifically gives you permission.
 - ❖ **Always** be very careful in chat rooms. Even if a chat room says it is only for children, there is no way to tell if everyone there is really a child. It might be an adult or an older child trying to trick you.
 - ❖ **Never** send your picture, credit card or bank details to anyone, without first checking with your parent/guardian.
 - ❖ **Always** check with your parent/guardian that it is okay to be in a chat room.
 - ❖ **Never** arrange to meet anyone unless your parent/guardian goes with you and you meet in a public place. People you contact online are not always who they seem or who they say they are.
 - ❖ **Always** leave a chat room if someone says or writes something which makes you feel uncomfortable or worried and make sure you tell your parent/guardian.
 - ❖ **Never** open attachments to emails unless they come from someone you know and trust. They could contain viruses or other programs which would destroy all the information and software on your computer.
 - ❖ **Always** keep your password to yourself; do not tell anyone what it is.
 - ❖ **Never** respond to nasty or suggestive messages and always tell your parent/guardian if you get these.
 - ❖ **Always** stay away from sites that say they are for people over 18 only. The warnings are there to protect you. Adult sites can sometimes cost a lot more on your phone bill too.
 - ❖ **Always** remember if someone makes you an offer that seems too good to be true, it is probably a trick.

PREPARATORY SCHOOL 2008 BOOKLISTS

OUT OF SCHOOL CARE NEWS

End of School Year arrangements: Monday 3 December - Centre open **all day** for Kindergarten to Year 3 children; Before and After School Care as usual for Year 4 to Year 7.

Tuesday 4 December - Centre open **all day** for Kindergarten to Yr 3 children; Before School Care and end of year Early Closure 12.30pm.

2008 Start of the new School year: The Out of School Care will open at 12 noon for the first three weeks of Term 1 to accommodate the Kindergarten and Pre Primary early closures. Booking essential and normal fees will apply.

The Out of School Care has a greater number of children each year and the enrolments are forever on the rise. A decision has been made to relocate the Centre to the larger and more favourable premises of Woodgate House. The Centre will open its new doors at the start of the 2008 school year.

Age groups will have their own separate rooms with age appropriate equipment and a specific staff member. The younger children will have direct access to the much improved and fully enclosed

Pre-Primary playground. The older age group will have plenty of space to enjoy indoor table games, kick a footy on the oval or play a game of tennis on the courts. Social interaction will be encouraged during snack times.

The new facilities will house a separate Homework room and Sickbay.

The staff will continue to offer this great service which comprises Before and After School and Vacation Care Programs.

Please make some time available to familiarise yourself with the new premises on the Grand Opening night Wednesday 6th February 2008.
