## 2026 Domestic Fees and Charges

### Application Fee

A non-refundable fee of \$150 is payable when the completed application form is received by the School. Please refer to the **Application for Enrolment** document for available payment methods.

### Acceptance/Endowment Fee

A non-refundable capital contribution of \$6,000 is payable per child upon acceptance of a place, following a successful interview with the Principal or their delegate. Families will be provided with a grace period, outlined in their offer of enrolment, to make this payment. Payment secures a place at the School up to 24 months prior to commencement.

A 50% reduction applies for siblings of students who are enrolled at the School at the time of acceptance (under these Terms), for students commencing in Years 11 and 12, and for children or grandchildren of Old Guildfordians. Old Guildfordians must be current members of the Old Guildfordian Association to be eligible for the reduction. Please refer to the **Acceptance of Enrolment Agreement** for details of available payment methods.

These Terms apply to new families applying to the School from 1 January 2026, and/or to students commencing from 2028. Families with a child already enrolled at the School, or who have submitted an application prior to 20 October 2025 and been accepted and paid their Endowment Fee on or before 31 December 2025, will remain subject to the 2025 Fees and Charges Endowment Fee Terms and Conditions.

### Payment of accounts

The Principal will not permit further tuition to be provided for any student whose fees are not received by the due date. Parents experiencing difficulties in meeting their fee commitment should discuss alternative arrangements with the Finance Office. Whilst every attempt will be made to support a suitable payment plan, ongoing arrears will lead to formal recovery procedures. Students are not eligible to attend tours and optional camps while accounts are more than 30 days overdue.

### Sibling discount

The School offers a 10% discount on the tuition fee for the second and subsequent siblings whilst two or more children are attending the School at the same time and who are not in receipt of any other form of financial assistance including but not limited to a scholarship\* or bursary.

*\* Some minor scholarships/prizes may be excluded at the discretion of the School.*

### Resource Levy

The School charges an annual compulsory, non-refundable Resource Levy that is different for each year group, calculated on actual costs paid to third-party vendors for the provision of services unique to each year group. This Levy includes key programs such as; the Outdoor Learning Program (OLP) for Years 1-9, our School Provided Technology Program (SPTP), plus Digital subscriptions and stationery (Preparatory School only) relevant to each year group.

Additionally, for Year 12 students, the Resource Levy includes non-refundable costs for Valedictory attendance (covering student participation and up to two family tickets), as well as membership to the Old Guildfordians Association, ensuring continued connection with the Guildford Grammar School community beyond graduation. This Levy is not subject to pro-rata adjustment for mid-year enrolments or withdrawals.

### Additional Charges

Guildford Grammar School's tuition fees are designed to be as inclusive as possible, with the Resource Levy introduced in 2025 providing families with greater clarity in their financial planning. Other expenses will apply for items such as uniforms, canteen purchases, bus services, co-curricular clubs and activities, Music and Speech and Drama tuition, and Tours and Exchanges. These are paid separately through the relevant service: for example, uniforms through the Clothing Shop, co-curricular activities via Clipboard, and canteen purchases through Flexischools.



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## Payment Options

The School offers families four payment options as set out in this schedule.

Families are required to advise the School of their preferred option each year as prior or current year options cannot be automatically assumed or rolled over by the School.

Accounts can be viewed via the Guildford Grammar School Parent Portal. New families will be set up upon commencement at the School.

Families must advise the school before 28th January 2026 otherwise your account will default to option 3.

### Payment options

The payment options available are:

- Option 1: Payment in advance attracts a 1.5% discount on tuition and boarding fees when received in full prior to 27 January 2026.
- Option 2: Four (4) instalment payments of 2026 full fee by the start of each term, being 27 January, 21 April, 21 July and 13 October.
- Option 3: Nine (9) instalment payments of the 2026 full fee on a monthly basis for the period from February to October 2026 inclusive. Payment to occur on the 15th of each month.
- Option 4: Eighteen (18) instalment payments of the 2026 full fee on a fortnightly basis. The first payment will be taken on 17 February 2026 and fortnightly thereafter, with the final payment taken on 13 October 2026.

International student payments must be paid up front or termly.

### Payment methods

- **Direct debit:** To the School's bank account (please refer to the details on your school account / statement).
- **BPAY:** Via the internet using BPAY (Biller code and reference number appear on your school account/statement).
- **Credit Card:** Please refer to the details on your school account / statement. Third-party credit card processing fees may apply. Payment can also be made in person at the Finance Office, via the online Parent Portal or paid by telephone to (08) 9377 9206.

#### For families requiring more flexible payment arrangements:

The School does not have the capacity to provide fee payment support to families outside of the payment options and payment methods set out in this document. As such, the School engages with organisations that are resourced and structured to do so and their details are provided below for your consideration (please note that the School does not benefit in any way from our association with the following support partner).

### Bursaries

We recognise that life's circumstances can change, and we are committed to walking alongside our families during times of need. To ensure every student has the opportunity to continue their Guildford Grammar School journey, families experiencing significant financial difficulties may apply for a short-term bursary to assist them in meeting School fees. The pool of funds available under the Bursary Scheme is limited and applications must be received by 1 November of each year for assistance in the following year.

The Bursary Scheme is available to existing school families who require assistance through fee support for Senior School students from Year 7 but is not granted to Preparatory School students or new students entering the School. To be eligible for consideration of the Scheme, families need to ensure that their tuition and charges account with the School are in good order. Bursaries expire and are reviewed annually.

Applications are treated with the utmost confidentiality. Further details of the Scheme may be obtained from the Principal or Chief Financial Officer.



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### Boarding

The annual boarding fee covers accommodation, meals, laundering, and routine nursing. An \$800 Maintenance Bond for boarders is invoiced on the first fee statement for new boarders. The bond is refundable upon the student leaving boarding and all outstanding accounts being settled. Parents may opt to donate this bond to the School Building Fund upon leaving. Any damage to property or accommodation is withdrawn from this bond. For regional, national and international students, the School will not fund the cost of travel to and from School for each term.

### Bus services

### Parents and Friends' Society (P&F)

Membership of the Parents and Friends' Society is open to any parent/guardian with a child at the School. A levy of \$65 per family is included in the annual fee account which supports the work of the Society and its sub-committees – Friends of Preparatory School (FOPS), Friends of Senior School (FOSS) and Boarding Parents' Association (BPA). The P&F Society works closely with the School to deliver value back to the community. Payment is optional but recommended and greatly appreciated. Should you choose not to subscribe, please note this on your account and advise the Finance Office prior to 27 January 2026.

### Goods and Services Tax (GST)

The School reserves the right to pass on any GST that may be applicable.

### Insurance

Worldwide personal accident insurance, including a tutorial benefit, is provided for all students taking part in school activities or work experience, including travel between home and the School. Details are available from the Finance Office on 9377 9206. Please note, this insurance only covers non-Medicare medical expenses.

Overseas Student Health Cover (OSHC) is mandatory for all students on student visas to cover medical expenses arising from accident or illness. In an emergency, your child will be taken to the School Medical Centre or Public Hospital. All students must be covered by the health cover held by the parents.

### Property insurance

It is strongly recommended that parents check their health and general insurance policies to ensure adequate medical, personal property and liability insurance cover for their children. The School cannot accept responsibility for medical expenses arising from accident or illness, loss of or damage to personal effects and property or liability incurred by students for bodily injury or property damage. However, most householders' policies give a limited cover for the property of a householder and dependents while the property is temporarily removed from the home to another location. Parents are advised to examine their policies and, if in doubt, check with their insurance company. Student devices are covered according to the School Provided Technology Program.

### Withdrawal of a student

1. The Principal must be given a minimum of a term's notice in writing prior to the withdrawal of a student, or a term's tuition fees will be charged in lieu of such notice. Signature of all enrolling parties, where applicable, must be recorded. Please contact the Head of Admissions for a **Withdrawal from Enrolment Declaration** form. For those considering withdrawing their child at the end of 2025, written notice must be received by Monday 20 October 2025.
2. The annual Resource Levy is payable in full, regardless of withdrawal during the school year, as resources and programs are allocated and funded at the start of the year.
3. An offer of enrolment for boarding will be for the four terms of the year.
4. Enrolment as a day student and/or boarder in Year 12 is for the full academic year of four terms.
